Most importantly, Patsy Ann had a rare gift for making everyone feel unconditionally loved, regardless of their misgivings or mistakes.

She was preceded in death by her beloved son, Gary John Egan; her parents; and all 12 of her siblings. She is survived by her daughter, Crystal and her
